Primocane Fruiting Blackberry

New Primocane-fruiting meaning it sets fruit on first year wood. Also sets fruit on second year wood (Floricanes).

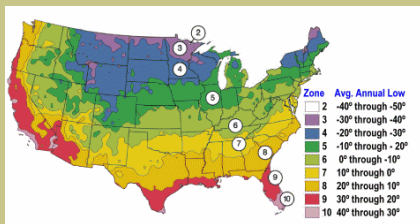
Erect growing, thorny.
Flavor/Sweetness - Good, similar to other thorny varieties. Small seed size.

Yield - Floricane yields exceed many of the best. Primocane yields vary greatly by location, from very high in the Willamette Valley of Oregon to very low at Hope, Arkansas.

Ripening: Floricane fruits in summer, Primocane fruits in late Fall.

Recommended for home garden use but only for trial in commercial use. Not recommended for storage nor shipping. Summer temperatures above 85° F can reduce fruit set, size and quality on primocanes.

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 6 but will fruit down to Zone 4 on Primocanes even if Floricanes are frost damaged.
