Rubus sp.

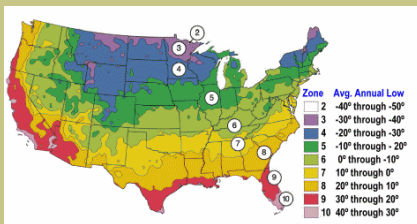
A Texas A&M variety released in 1959.

It is a vigorous, upright, thorny, attractive blackberry and has been the standard in Texas for 35 years.

Its healthy canes produce a high yield of large fruit. The tart acid-flavored fruit is usually recommended for cooking more than for the fresh market. Disease resistant.

Ripens: June to July

Cold hardy to
U.S.D.A. Zone 7.



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
