

Kiowa Blackberry

Rubus sp.

These huge, flavorful blackberries are impressive and weigh 11-13 grams – the largest of all the Arkansas varieties!

Make delicious fresh cobbler with these black beauties. Use them on your cereal, make your own fresh juice or wine, or eat them right off the bush.

Blooms earlier and longer than most other blackberries. You'll start eating Kiowa in early June.

NOTE: Orange rust resistant. Moderately resistant to anthracnose.

This thorned variety grows 5-6' tall with a 4-8' spread.

Ripens: Early June

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 6.

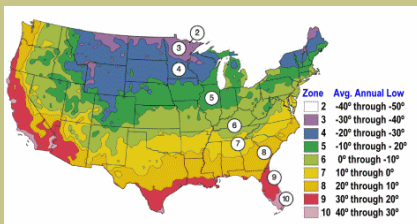
