

Arkansas Black Apple

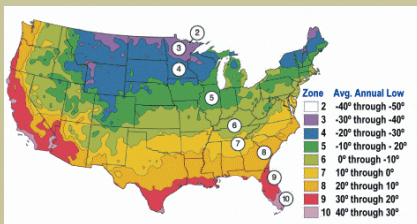
Malus sp.

Medium sized fruit with dark red skin, almost black in color. Flesh is firm, white and crisp. The flavor is balanced, pleasant and sweet and is excellent for juice. Tree bark is almost black. Resistant to cedar apple rust and moderately resistant to apple codling moth. Hardy and vigorous.

Requires 800-900 hours of chill below 45°F.

Ripens: October to November.

Cold Hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 4.



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
