

Northern Spy Apple

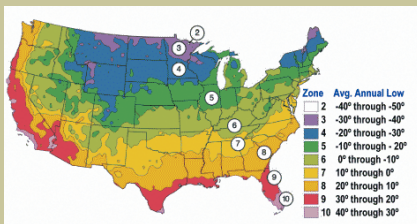
Malus sp.

Said to be the best winter apple in the East. Does well in Northern California also. Large greenish-yellow apple with red striping. Cream colored flesh is firm, but tender, crisp and juicy. Stores well. Good for fresh eating or pies. Developed in New York in 1800. Very hardy and late blooming.

Requires 1000 hours of chill below 45 °F.

Ripens: October to early November.

Cold Hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 4.



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
