

Golden Amber Apricot

Prunus armeniaca Sp.

Large apricot. Light orange skin. Flesh is firm, fine, melting. Excellent flavor. Pit burn resistant.

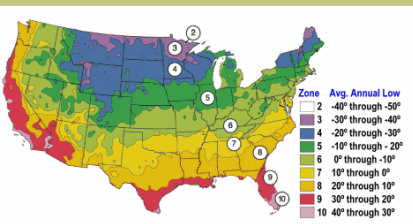
Has a prolonged, progressive blooming period of almost 30 days and a similar ripening period. Blooming period makes this a great selection for frost prone areas as you rarely lose the whole bloom to a late frost.

Progressive ripening is ideal for the home garden so you do not waste fruit when you get too much all at once.

Ripens: mid-June to mid-July

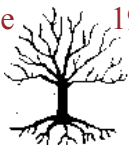
Requires 500 hours chilling below 45° F.
