

Spring Satin Plumcot

Prunus sp. cross

This new cultivar is the first plumcot that is well adapted to the medium-high chill areas of the south. Plumcots developed in California haven't done well in the south.

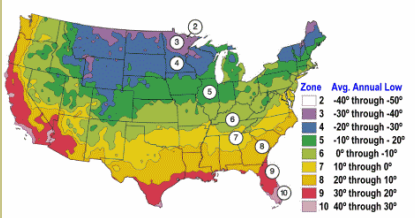
Large 2", high quality fruit. Reddish-black skin with yellowish-red flesh.

Freestone. Self fertile.

This unique cross is tolerant to major plum diseases, like bacterial spot disease, bacterial canker disease, and plum leaf scald.

Ripens: Late May
Requires 750 Chilling Hours below 45° F.

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 6.
