

Black Corinth Grape (Zante Currant)

Vitis vinifera sp.

Black Corinth is often called “Champagne Grape” by the epicureans (those that enjoy good food). They are called Zante Currants when dried.

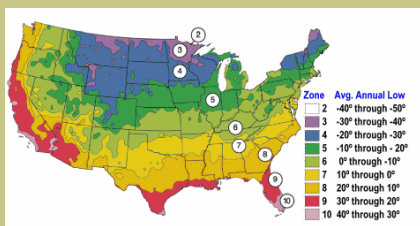
Dark red to black grape, firm skinned and crunchy with a sweet flavor. Flesh is juicy and a neutral to spicy flavor. Seedless.

Used extensively in baking or edible garnishment.

Cane pruned.

Ripens: Early September

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 6b - to about 0° F.



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
