

Fruiting Japanese Apricot (Ume) Shiro-Kaga (Single White) *Prunus sp.*

Small fruit 3/4" to 1" diameter. Used primarily for pickling and medicinal purposes.

Single white flowers have a spicy fragrance, and bloom from late January to early February.

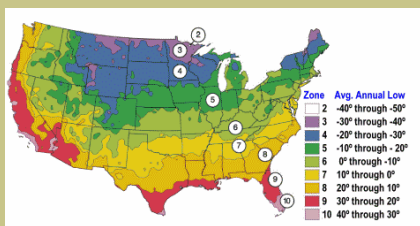
Does well in mild winter areas.

Requires 400 hours chilling below 45° F.

Ripens: Mid May.

Cold Hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 7.
