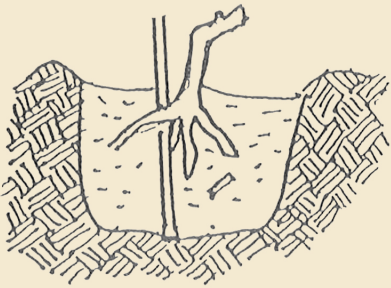


Bare Root Grape Planting Guide

1. Prune top. Cut vine to a single spur with 2-4 buds.
2. Prune all broken or extra long roots.
3. Dig a big hole so new roots can get a good start.
4. Set spur 2" above ground.
5. Backfill with 1 part soil amendment to 3 parts soil. Add slow release fertilizer.
6. Water in well and DO NOT WATER again until in leaf.



1. To begin training, confine growth the first year. Prune to remove suckers. Train one cane straight up.
2. Prune back in winter to begin spur, cane, or cordon training. See links below for more information.
