

Black Butte Blackberry

Rubus laciniatus sp.

“World’s Largest” blackberry is huge, measures up to 1” in diameter by 2” long, nearly twice the size of other fresh blackberries.

Firmer fruit suitable for fresh eating. Grown on trailing canes. Grows well in areas that stay above 10 degrees F.

Ripens: Late June, 4-6 weeks earlier than other fresh market blackberries.

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 8.

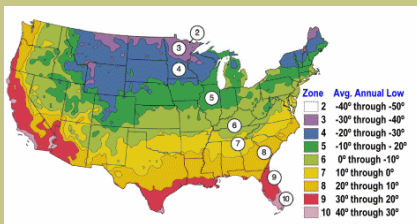
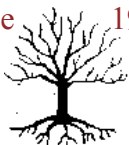
