Austin Dewberry

Rubus sp.


Very similar to Blackberries. They ripen earlier and give a little larger fruit. Large, black berry. Excellent less acid flavor. Produces large, sweet, flavorful fruit and is great for eating fresh, freezing or baked into cobblers and pies.

This dewberry is derived from Native American trailing blackberry bushes. Austin Dewberry plants will require a trellis or staking.

They adapt well to heat, making it a very popular dewberry in the south.

Ripens: Mid-Season (late May in warmer climates).

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 6.







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
