Horseradish Armoracia rusticana

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A large, coarse, weedy looking herb cultivated for its roots for use as a pungent food relish.

Warning - Edible in small amounts only. Toxic if large amounts eaten.

Grows best in rich, moist soils and cool regions but can survive in a wide range of soils and climates.

Plant in late winter or early spring. Roots may be dug in winter or spring and will replenish themselves if a few roots are left in the soil.

Mature height is 3-5 feet.

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 2.
