Camperdown Weeping Elm

Ulmus glabra 'Camperdownii'

In 1640 the "Earl of Camperdown", in Dundee Scotland, noticed a branch growing on the floor of his elm forest. He grafted it to a scotch elm tree and it took hold producing the first Camperdown Elm. Gracefully weeping tree is described as a green waterfall in summer. Winter shows a bold and twisted branch structure.

Mature height is 15-20 feet with a spread of 20-30 feet.

Cold hardy to U.S.D.A. Zone 4.
