Everclear Lacebark Elm is set apart from other cultivars by its distinctly narrow habit. Much taller than wide at about 40 feet tall by 15 feet wide compared to other U. parvifolia which often grow wider than tall. A good street tree due to the narrow head with tight branch angles that keep the branches clear of traffic and buildings. Thus the name "Everclear"! It also makes a stately selection for small lawns and large courtyards.


Leaves are green, small - typical of the species. Fall color is yellow.
